Guidelines and Procedures

Arrival: Plan to arrive five minutes before your scheduled time and come to the Volunteer Station located in the back office.

- Stamp your parking ticket with red parking stamp.
- Place your personal belongings in the cabinet beneath the Volunteer Station (this includes cell phones, pagers, blackberrys, etc.).
- Enter your hours on your time sheet in the notebook.
- Get your nametag and apron.
- Read the weekly announcements.

If you cannot come on scheduled day:

Please let us know as far in advance as possible by completing a "Change of Schedule" form. You may also e-mail schedule changes to vol@vadm.org or call 434- 977-1025.

Appropriate clothing:

Comfortable and Practical – You may be sitting on the floor with children or working with craft projects. **Neat and Clean** – No holes, revealing clothing, or suggestive language. You do represent the Museum.

Daily Requirements:

- Encourage visitors to use the exhibits and enjoy the Museum.
- Interact with children and adults.
- Help the museum staff maintain a safe and attractive environment.
- Tidy up after the children by returning items to their appropriate places.
- Assist with various programs, special events, craft projects, etc.

Problems with visitors:

Contact a staff member immediately. Please always feel free to speak with the Volunteer Coordinator or other staff members about any questions or concerns you may have. We want volunteering to be a rewarding experience for you.

Important safety information:

Hurt or sick child – <u>Please report any accidents or injuries to a staff member immediately</u>. First aid kits are located in the Front Desk and in the Gallery Office, and ice packs are located in the freezer.

Fire – Fire extinguishers are located in the kitchen, studio, front entrance, and back gallery. If there is an evacuation, volunteers must leave the building, but may be asked to help outside directing people to reconvene at the post office or preventing persons from entering the building.

Snow Days:

The museum encourages safety first, so if the roads are treacherous, do not drive. If you are not sure if the Museum is open, call to check after 9:00 a.m.

Guests:

Quick tours for friends are fine – free and encouraged. For "real visits" – use the passes you earn. Also, please refrain from bringing your own children or kids that you baby-sit during your volunteer time. We want you to be available to all the visitors.
